## **Subject: The Birth Of A Saint:**

A saint is a person who has been born again, and has adorned the nature of God. A holy person has been called a saint by God since the fall of man. When God saves a person to be a saint, they will become holy by the power of God's Holy Spirit that God will give the person. To be holy means to be righteous or sin-free. To be born again is to be born of the nature of God by the Spirit of God to become a saint.

God created the first man holy. Adam was a holy man until he disobeyed God, and became alienated from the Commonwealth of Heaven. Then those who were begotten of Adam came into the world as sinners, but God arranged that man who had lost the holy nature of God might be born again in Christ. The first man (Adam) had all men born separated from God, but the second man (Christ) gave us a chance to be reconciled to God.

Christ offers the second birth for man to come back to God to regain the holiness that was lost in Adam. Your first birth of your parents was a conception produced from the seed of Adam, but your second birth in Christ is produced from the seed of God, which is the word of God that we believed when we heard it. Your first birth was the birth of a physical body. Your second birth in Christ is the birth of a new mind that will administer power to your physical body to live a sin-free life.

## Subject: The Saints Will Experience A Renewing Of The Holy Ghost:

During these last days, God is presently calling Saints together. Listen to Psalm 50:5, which teaches what God is going to do in the last days:

Verse 5 - Gather my Saints together unto me; those that have made a covenant with me by sacrifice.

Saints are those who will present themselves to God as living sacrifices. Listen to how the book of Psalms is articulated with the book of Romans 12:1. David is prophesying in the book of Psalms what the saints will do in Romans 12:1.

- Verse 1 I Beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.
- Verse 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

When you become a sacrifice to God by means of a covenant, it means that you will not be conformed to this world, but that you will be transformed by a renewing of your mind that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God.

When you are transformed by a renewing of your mind, it means that you have been renewed in the spirit of your mind by a washing of regeneration, which is a renewed work of the Holy Ghost. Listen to Ephesians 4:22-23:

- Verse 22 That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts;
- Verse 23 And that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness.

This is a renewed work of the Holy Spirit. Listen to Titus 3:4-5:

- Verse 4 But after that the kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared,
- Verse 5 Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost.

## Subject: If You Are Born Again Your Life Should Be Sin-Free:

When you are born again, the Spirit of God runs through your veins just as blood runs through your veins. The Spirit of God will purge, or clean your life mentally so that your mind will acquire a desire to live righteously. Blood will simply give your body healthy, physical functions, but the Spirit of God will give your mind righteous desires that will cause your physical functions to be sin-free.

The blood of Jesus that was shed on Calvary administered power to everybody who believed His gospel to purge and purify their minds so that their actions would be sin-free.
