Subject: What Will Happen To The Sinner Who Does Not Get Saved?

There are only two spirits that exist in the world; they are the Spirit of God and the spirit of the devil. People who live wickedly are sinners and they live the life of the devil. They have the spirit of the devil. People who are born again have the Spirit of God, and they live a holy life.

Those who have the spirit of the devil may seem to be enjoying themselves, but in reality they are very miserable, because the devil does not give joy. The devil creates deceiving pleasures in acts of sin that later result to disappointments, sadness, and woes. Such deceiving pleasures of the devil may give fun and thrills for a while, but afterward there will be condemnation and death. The sinner is of the devil and his or her life and soul belong to the devil. Listen to St. John 3:8:

Verse 8 - He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning...

The devil was the first sinner who was cast out of heaven where joy and happiness are given. The devil has no access to joy and happiness, because he was separated from God who is the producer of joy and happiness. So then, the devil only has access to miseries, deceitful thrills, and fun that will not last, just as the devil's place in God's creation will not last.

When a sinner dies, his or her life or soul will go to be with the devil, and the body of a sinner will return to the dust. The sinner will then remain with the devil until the second resurrection. When the sinner rises from the dead, the devil will be there to claim the sinner's soul. The sinner will then be turned into hell along with the devil and all evil angels that followed the devil.

The second resurrection of the sinner will not take place until after the saints have been caught up in the first resurrection with Jesus. A period of one-thousand years will elapse and then will come the second death when the devil and all sinners will be permanently separated from God.

Subject: The Second Death Has No Power Over The Saved Person:

Now you do not have to be holy unless you want to be, but if you hope to be in the first resurrection, you must be holy to qualify. To be holy means to be living free from sin. Listen to Revelation 20:6:

The first resurrection will be for the born again saints, and little children seven years of age and younger. If you are not holy the second death will have authority over your life, and it will keep you out of the first resurrection. The second death will consist of eternal misery in a lake of fire and brimstone. Listen further to Verse 6:

Verse 6 continued on such the second death hath no power,

Only Jesus can save you from the second death. After Jesus was crucified, the second death had no power over Jesus, and it will have no power over those who have received Jesus. The first death of the physical body is meaningless if you are saved. It will only be a peaceful rest. The second death will separate you from God if you are not saved, and you will experience eternal death being forever separated from God.

Though we were born separated from God while we were sinners, we don't have to continue in that condition. This is because God sent Jesus to the earth to teach us how to acquire a new-birth, or to be born again of the Spirit of God. Though some of us may die physically, we shall never experience the second death, which is a spiritual death. After that you have been born again of the Spirit of God, there is no power in death that can destroy your life eternally.

Subject: The Judgment:

Now, the Bible teaches that the first resurrection will take place a thousand years before the second resurrection. The second resurrection will be strictly for the unsaved. After the first resurrection there will be no other chance for anybody to be saved. In Revelation 20:5 it teaches that the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousand years were finished. The 'rest of the dead' refers to those who died and did

not get saved.

There will be a one thousand year period of time between the two resurrections: God will not make a mistake and allow an unsaved person to get up in the first resurrection, neither will He leave a saved person after the first resurrection to get up a thousand years later in the second resurrection.

At the end of one thousand years following the first resurrection at the Great White Throne, the Judgement will take place, and God Himself shall set the judgment for the saints who will be called in the first resurrection to judge the wicked (unsaved). The saints who were in the first resurrection will be used to judge those who get up in the second resurrection. Listen to Revelations 20:11-15:

Verse 11 - And I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away, and there was found no place for them.

John is teaching that there will be no place for the wicked to escape the judgment of God.

Verse 12 - And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is the book of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works.

God keeps a record in heaven of every thought, word and deed, and it is on record in the book for the judgment day. God hears every word you say, and not only that, He also sees every deed you perform.

Verse 13 - And the sea gave up the dead which were in it: and death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them: and they were judged every man according to their works.

The word 'hell' means the grave, or a prison in this passage of scripture, but there will be another hell, a place of fire and brimstone. Death and hell mean death and the grave. They will give up the dead that will be in them.

Verse 14 - And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death.

Death and hell mean the grave, and death and hell are going to be plagued, and the grave will be destroyed after the second resurrection. The lake of fire is the actual hell, or eternal place of torment.

Verse 15 - And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire.

Subject: What About Hell?

Hell is torment. Hell will be prepared for eternal torment because it will have a flame that cannot be quenched, much like the sun that we see in the sky. The Holy Spirit regulates the sun by means of keeping it a proper distance from the earth; but for those who go to hell, they will have direct contact with the flame living in bodies that can suffer torment, but will not be consumed. You can receive a break from pains and miseries in this present world by means of medication and clinical treatments; but in hell the torment will be without interruption.

After Jesus returns in the first resurrection, the saved people will be separated from the unsaved, and from that day throughout eternity, the unsaved will be in continuous company of wicked people. They will spend a thousand years together on this earth, and after the judgment of God takes place they will all be sent to hell for everlasting torment being miserable company for one another in hell, or a lake of fire and brimstone. The devil that made their lives so miserable in this world will also be in hell with them.
